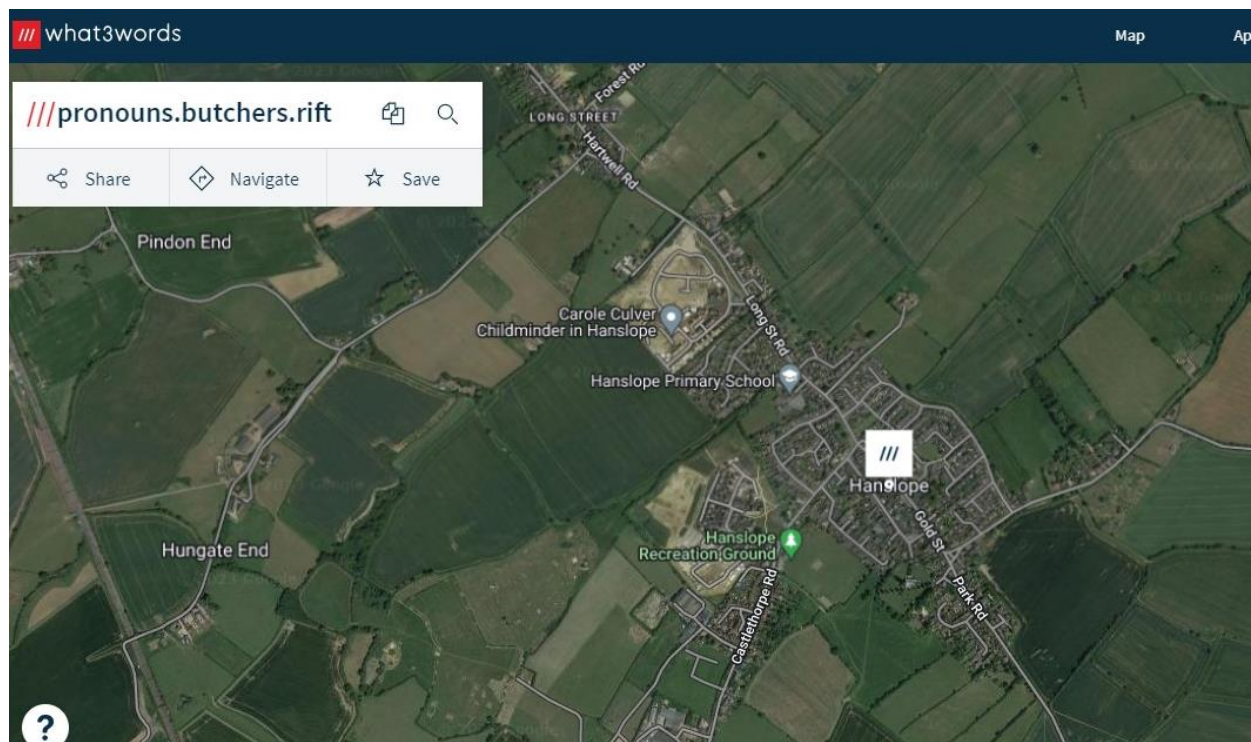
Community Forum Meeting for the North Rural West Community

This Month's Crime Reduction Advice is – Fly Tipping and how to report this

I have noticed that fly tipping (the illegal dumping of household rubbish) seems to be a continual problem throughout the rural areas, and I have plotted the locations onto a map. The areas that have been used to leave household waste (furniture & black bins filled with rubbish), along with the remains of cannabis plants and set ups.

I always photograph the rubbish, and use the 3 words app to give a precise location, I then contact the council online, and they will give you a reference number, they will then email you back, when it has been removed.



I have identified 45 different areas where fly tipping has been left., I would ask that if you are out and about your village walking the dog, taking the children to school etc. If you come across fly tipping can, I please ask you to report, examples below of recent fly tipping in the area.



MK COUNCIL ADVICE

If you see, any dumped rubbish let us know as soon as possible. If you witness fly tipping record the location, date, time and the vehicle registration number if possible, Call our Customer Services on 01908 252570 or complete this [online report](#). This link will take you to the MK Council or search MK Council report fly tipping report.

LOCAL PCSO ADVICE

If you see a person or vehicle leaving rubbish beside the road etc., if it is safe to do so make a note of the registration number and a description of the driver. Please call 101 and report the vehicle.

IF YOU ARE GETTING RUBBISH TAKEN AWAY

Householders have a duty to ensure that their household waste is only given to an authorised waste carrier to dispose of or taken to a licensed waste site. They must take all steps reasonable to ensure their waste isn't illegally dumped:

- Check the tradesperson is a registered waste carrier with a valid licence. Ask to see their Waste Carrier Licence, which they should have with them or check online by searching the [Environment Agency's Public Register](#).
- Ask where they will take your waste? If in doubt, don't use them
- Get a receipt with the carrier's name and address
- Take down their registration number
- How much are they charging? If it sounds too good to be true, then it probably is

Householders can be fined up if they pass their waste to an unlicensed waste carrier, which is subsequently fly-tipped.
