Thames Valley Alerts is a free email messaging system where you can receive regular crime updates, information on ongoing incidents and crime prevention relevant to your local area.

By signing up to Thames Valley Alerts you can get involved in helping to make your local area a safer place, tell us what the police should be doing in your area, shape the initiatives that help to keep people and property safe and tell us what matters are causing your communities harm.

Milton Keynes welcomes new police Commander

Next week, on Monday 3 April, Superintendent Emma Baillie will step into the role of Commander for the Milton Keynes local policing area (LPA). After three years in the role, Superintendent Marc Tarbit is moving into a strategic role within the force.

Supt Baillie brings with her a wealth of experience having worked in roles spanning response policing, intelligence development and commanding large incidents and operations, including the force response to the Coronavirus pandemic. Most recently, she has worked as the lead for Thames Valley Police in the national Uplift programme, helping to recruit over 600 additional officers. She has also held responsibility for the allocation of officers and staff across the force area and their training. Before this, she was Head of the Armed Response department spanning the Thames Valley and Hampshire areas.

Share Your Thoughts on the Structure of Local Policing

There is still time to share your thoughts on our review into the structure of our local policing areas.

The review aims to enhance the service we provide, with no decision being made to the detriment of neighbourhood policing. Two proposals are being considered, which will both keep the same number of neighbourhood teams and seek to increase the number of officers in visible patrol roles.

The models under consideration are:

- A continuation of the current 11 Local Policing Area (LPA) model, but with enhancements where possible, or
- A five-area command model; the five areas would be Oxfordshire, Berkshire West, Berkshire East, Buckinghamshire and Milton Keynes.

What personal information do you require?

To sign up to the Thames Valley Alert system, you are required to complete a registration form online which will help us to target our information to you.

Will you share my details with other agencies?

During the registration process and in your 'administration' area you will have the opportunity to review and select additional licensed information providers who will, if authorised by you, be able to see your data and send you messages. Although all the information providers listed may not be actively using the system at this time, you will be notified as they come on board. You can remove any information provided at any time.

Will you send me spam?

No, the only communication we will have with you will be via the Thames Valley Alert email and occasional consultation via email.

Can I cancel my subscription?

You can opt out of the entire system or update your settings to configure the types of messages that you want to receive and remove the ones you don't want at any time. Emails from the Thames Valley Alert system have a link at the bottom to 'change settings'; simply click on this link to review your settings and update them.

Why do you ask for my telephone and mobile number?

The Thames Valley Alert system allows us to send messages via telephone and text services, however, we will only be communicating regularly with you via email, so it is important you include an email address. On very rare occasions, when we need to get information out to you in an emergency, we may use the text services. If you don't include an email address, you will not receive any messages from us. Also you may be contacted by an Alert coordinator if your email becomes unavailable for whatever reason.

Can I reply to the email?

Yes, we welcome your comments and thoughts. Clicking on the 'reply' link within a message will send your reply to the person that sent the message and your local policing team.

Do you read the emails?

Yes, all emails are read and appropriately actioned. Please be aware that sometimes we will not reply if it is simply information you want to pass to us for our attention. Even if you do not hear from us directly then please be assured that everything you send to us is reviewed.

Do others see my email address?

No, other subscribers will not see any of your details.

Can I forward or print out Thames Valley Alert messages and share it with friends, or is it confidential?

These emails are not confidential and we welcome you to introduce others to the system. We do advise that you remove any personal details you do not wish to share, such as email addresses. Friends and family can sign up to Thames Valley Alert by visiting www.thamesvalleyalert.co.uk

Can I change my contact details if I move house or internet provider?

Yes, use the links at the bottom of the Thames Valley Alert email, or visit your account details on the Thames Valley Alert website.

Does Thames Valley Alert cost me anything?

No, Thames Valley Alert subscription is free, no other charges or fees will be incurred.

Is this to replace Neighbourhood Watch?

No, this will not be replacing any Neighbourhood Watch schemes. We hope it will complement existing schemes and initiatives. Thames Valley Alert is linked to the national Neighbourhood Watch 'Our Watch' system and will improve the way in which police and Watch schemes are able to communicate with and support each other.

Can I report crime by email?

No, this system is not intended to receive information about crimes, you can report crimes by calling 101. In an emergency always dial 999.

Can I use Thames Valley Alert in an emergency?

No, in an emergency you should always dial 999. An emergency is when there is a risk of serious injury, there is risk of serious damage to property, you suspect a crime is in progress or there is a serious incident which needs immediate police attendance.
